Electricity	Players, Members & Visitors	Injury	Medium/Low	Ensure all unnecessary electrical appliances are switched off after use	Low	Senior Committee

Slipping, tripping and falling	Injury	Injury	Medium/Low	- The pavilion is well maintained and cleaned on a regular basis - Spillages are cleaned promptly	Low	Senior Committee

Injury during matches and training	Players, Umpires & Public	Injury	Medium	- Matches properly regulated. - Players are selected to play at appropriate level. - Net practice properly supervised. - Safehands administrators to ensure that the coaches / instructors are qualified and where applicable a DBS check is completed and verified by the appropriate authorities. - Players to be made aware of level of club's insurance. - Player's to be encouraged to take out personal insurance should the club's insurance not meet their needs if injury prevents them from working etc	Low	Coaches, Umpires, Captains & Selection Committee.
Tripping, slipping or being hit by the ball due to bumpy or wet outdoor playing surface	Players, Umpires & Public	Injury	Medium	- Maintain playing surface in good condition. - Check that the playing area is safe and free from obstacles and spectators are at a safe distance - Decision made by umpires in conjunction with the captains as to the playing of a game or not - Players to be made aware of level of club's insurance - Player's to be encouraged to take out personal insurance should the club's insurance not meet their needs if injury prevents them from working etc	Low	Umpires, Groundsman, Captains & Coaches
Player with a medical condition	Players	Medical difficulty	Low	- Club Safeguarding Officer (CSO) to check that all players' membership forms are up to date with current medical information and emergency contact details are available. - Participants encouraged to disclose any injury or medical conditions before activity starts	Very low	CSOs, Coaches, Captains & Committee
Players getting injured because they have not warmed up correctly	Players	Injury	Low	- Players taught how to warm up appropriately during training sessions. - Participants encouraged to warm up and cool down and to wear appropriate clothing (including protection from the sun)	Very low	Coaches, Captains & Players
Lack of suitable equipment	Players	Injury	Low	- Players wear appropriate protective equipment (pads, box, gloves and optional helmet). The club has spare protective equipment should individuals not have their own. - All players Under 18 must wear a helmet whilst batting and wicket keeping whilst standing up to the stumps	Very low	Captains & Players
Dehydration	Players	Medical problem	Low	- Drink breaks to be determined between Umpires and Captains before the game commences and weather conditions to be considered in this process. - Players encouraged to keep hydrated. - Players encouraged to place drinks on the boundary whilst in the field - Remove player to cool conditions. Seek medical attention if required	Very low	Umpires, Captains & Players

Property damaged by balls	Pavilion & surrounding properties	Damage to property	Medium	- Roll-on nets must face away from property during training sessions. - Suitable level of Public Liability Insurance of £5 million - Look into the feasibility of creating other ball stop barrier to help reduce the numbers of balls being hit out of the ground. People putting their heads into the nets when retrieving a ball	Players, Coaches & Members	Injury	Medium	- Coaches to educate players on safety - Coaches and participants to be alert to stop the activity if this happens	Low	Coaches
Player impact with obstacles beyond the boundary	Players	Injury	Medium	- Ensure boundary is a sufficient distance from the pavilion / abounding hedges / fencing / garages - All machinery / equipment is put away into the garages during matches / training where possible - Cars to be parked away from boundary line. - Ensure all training drills take place in areas of the outfield that are away from obstacles	Low	Coaches, Groundsman, Captains & Players
